**SHERIFF'S REPORT:**

Sgt. Mattke handed out his monthly Sheriff's Report to the Board Members. He stated that things were pretty quiet in Raymond last month. There was one minor vandalism.

**PUBLIC COMMENT – Discussion of any matter raised by the Public:**

**SHARON KORPONAI**

Stated that when the Raymond Storm Water Utility District was formed, the Town was trying to get out of the Racine County Drainage Commission. That was the whole purpose of forming the SWUD for the Town.

Chairman Kastenson stated that the RCDC has fixed all of the ends of the tiles feeding into the Root River, and they have kept it sprayed. They are doing a good job.

Alvin Wilks stated that once you are in the RCDC, it is very difficult to get out. The RCDC can do a lot more than the Town's SWUD.

Sharon Korponai stated that if you look in the minutes from years ago, the Town was told by RCDC that there was hope that the Town could get out of the RCDC. That was one reason why the Town formed our own SWUD.

Mr. Wilks stated that by not having RCDC, it would cause a lot of water problems.

John Strueder has a letter from Madison stating that it is very hard to "get out" of the Drainage District; however, the "power can be transferred".

There was a question on what Raymond pays to the RCDC.

Mr. Wilks stated that it is split: 40% from Yorkville; 40% from Union Grove, and 20% from the Town of Raymond.

**STAN BUGNACKI**

Stated that, on 43<sup>rd</sup> Street, there is wood piled up from the clean out - this should be cleared out by now.

Chris Stamborski stated that it will be cleaned up as soon as it dries out a little bit – the contractor doesn't want to leave a mess. The contractor has not been paid in full yet, and he does know that all of the wood needs to be removed first.

Chairman Kastenson reiterated that before the contractor is paid in full, the wood needs to be cleared up.

**BRIAN GOODE**

Updated the Town Board on the Raymond Youth Baseball Program. They have sold 10 of the 12 spaces for the signs already. They are just waiting to hear back from the Town's Attorney regarding the Maintenance Agreement.

He would like to know when the Town's DPW will be removing the equipment from the pavilion at the diamonds. They would like it removed in April.

He also stated they are up 10% in registration.
